<i>Liriope muscari</i>	Big Blue Lilyturf, part of the asparagus family

<i>Thymus Serpyllum</i>	Wild Thyme	Pollinator friendly, edible
<i>Hyssopus officinalis</i>	Hyssop (purple flowers)	Pollinator friendly, edible
<i>Achillea</i> 'Moondust'	Yarrow	Pollinator friendly
<i>Oreganum</i> 'Rosenkuppel'	Oregano	Pollinator friendly
<i>Allium schoenoprasum</i>	Chives	Pollinator friendly, edible
<i>Hylotelephium</i> 'Purple Emperor'	Orpine 'Purple Emperor' (a succulent)	Pollinator friendly

<i>Amelanchier lamarckii</i> (multistemmed)	Juneberry (tree)	Berries, pollinator friendly
<i>Chaenomeles speciosa</i> 'Nivalis'	Japanese quince tree	Early nectar
<i>Lonicera x heckrottii</i> 'Gold Flame'	Honeysuckle (climber)	Pollinator friendly
<i>Polystichum polyblepharum</i>	Japanese lace fern	
<i>Ajuga reptans</i>	Bugle or carpetweed (and in the mint family)	Pollinator friendly
<i>Narcissus</i> 'Hawera'	Daffodils	Scented

<i>Sarcococa confuse</i>	An evergreen bush that looks like a garden hedge	Early nectar, scented
<i>Hakonechloa macra</i> 'All Gold'	A grass sometimes called Ogon	
<i>Pulmonaria</i> 'Trevi Fountain'	Lungwort	
<i>Narcissi</i> 'Sergovia'	Daffodils	Scented
<i>Aster divaricata</i>	White wood aster like daisies	Pollinator friendly
<i>Tiarella cordifolia</i>	Foam flower	Pollinator friendly
<i>Betula utilis</i> var <i>jacquemontii</i> (multistemmed)	A himalyan birch tree with white trunks	
<i>Polystichum setiferum</i>	A soft shield fern	
<i>Cyclamen hederifolium</i>	Ivy leaved cyclamen and tuberous	
<i>Astrantia</i> 'Buckland'	Little pink flowers	Pollinator friendly
<i>Hebe odora</i> 'Nana'	Boxleaf hebe 'Nana' (an evergreen shrub)	
<i>Helleborus niger</i>	Christmas rose (flowers in winter)	Pollinator friendly
<i>Vinca minor</i> 'Atropurpurea'	Periwinkle (great coverage for the ground)	Pollinator friendly
<i>Geranium wallichianum</i> 'Crystal Lake'	Cranesbill (though hardy type - not the ones you find in Greece!)	Pollinator friendly
<i>Narcissus</i> 'Segovia'	Daffodils
